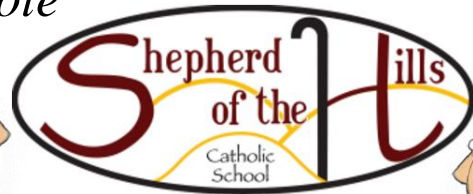


Parent Note
